It is difficult to single people out, but special thanks to Mike and Marilyn who did all sorts of things from looking after the Quilt to finding the Trench cake recipe. They have also produced a lovely photo book of the occasion which will be in the Church Library.

**Items for the next Samara’s Aid appeal** may be left in the back of Church from Christmas Eve to January 8<sup>th</sup>. Remember items must be worth the transport costs and be gifts of love. Why not ask friends or neighbours if they have donations, or use Nectar points to buy new? Especially underwear and men’s. Or buy a small item each time you shop. At the end of November Samara visited Syria. She worked in one of the small field hospitals (she is a highly qualified nurse) and oversaw donations in Ghouta. under siege until last Spring. She saw the container which was packed in Somerset being unloaded, so the contents of “our” boxes etc have just been distributed there! There is just too much to include here. Photos will be on the board in Church, but this 18 month old girl played in the mud while her parents worked in a polytunnel. Flyers will be in the back of church with fuller information for the distribution. This time the Smiley bags have been replaced by School bags and some specific stationery can be contributed as well. **Gifts for Epiphany.** At the Epiphany Party (see above) we want to pack a couple of Baby Care Packs so people can see what is involved. To bring a gift for a baby at Epiphany, even if you can’t come to the party (which would be a shame!) please take the gift tag with your chosen item to purchase from the back of Church. **Knitting** – now we have finished knitting poppies, we can turn our attention to knitting for the Appeal. 6” squares to be sewn into a blanket or any garment however simple for any age or size, but not “fish and chip” jumpers. These are designed as a single layer for new borns in Africa and do not suit what is needed in the Middle East. We have been given some wool, so if you want some, it is in the store room.
