WHO FIRST TOLD YOU ABOUT JESUS? Steve Cronin, LLM, writes:

Recently in church we celebrated All Saints Day, an opportunity for us to look back at the saints that have gone before us. At St Greg's we asked the question "Do you remember the person who first told you about Jesus?" Maybe it was your parents, grandparents, a Sunday School teacher perhaps? Perhaps your faith journey started much later as an adult?



I remember my first Sunday School Teacher, Miss Crathern, I know that she had been teaching the beginners class for many years before I started Sunday School and I believe she was the teacher when my brother and sister first started attending too. I remember those stories, often told with the help of flannelgraph images (a bit like Fuzzy Felt), also the child sized windsor chairs they had in the room. Over 60 years on I can still remember the influence of that faithful woman as she served the children in our church by telling them the good news of Jesus. Years went on, and those stories were repeated and expanded as my understanding developed as I went through Sunday school and youth groups. Indeed even now I often come away from church or preparing a service thinking "Well I hadn't noticed that before!".

I can think back to Miss Crathern and others who taught me the Good News of Jesus, and I can celebrate their witness as we think of All Saints. The Old Testament Reading for All Saints was Deuteronomy 6 vs 4 - 9 The Message Version puts it like this.....

#### Attention, Israel! God, our God! God the one and only!

Love God, your God, with your whole heart: love him with all that's in you, love him with all you've got! Write these commandments that I've given you today on your hearts. Get them inside of you and then get them inside your children. Talk about them wherever you are, sitting at home or walking in the street; talk about them from the time you get up in the morning to when you fall into bed at night. Tie them on your hands and foreheads as a reminder; inscribe them on the doorposts of your homes and on your city gates.

It's a challenge isn't it? I was challenged by the idea of talking about God and what he means to us, when we talk to our children, when we are walking along the street or sitting at home. From the time you get up until the time you go to bed. The Israelites were told to tie the commandments to their hands and foreheads and attached them to their doorposts to remind them so they didn't forget. It is the custom today for Jews to tie a phylactery (a small box containing scriptures), to their hands and heads when they go to pray. I wonder if we can say the same for our lives? Do we talk about Jesus, as we walk down the street or when we talk to our friends and neighbours? The early church we read about in the bible went from being a room full of scared disciples, to an unstoppable worldwide movement of over 2.4 billion believers, What a legacy!

As we fast approach Advent and a time when we have great opportunities to talk about Jesus and the real meaning of the Christmas story, maybe we could be the first person to tell someone about the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ?

Many of you will have heard what's known as the Serenity Prayer:


'God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; courage to change the things I can; and wisdom to know the difference.'


#### FUNERAL OF MISS BRENDA LOVELL



#### **BISHOP MIKE'S ENTHRONEMENT**

The Rt. Rev'd Dr Mike Harrison has been enthroned as the 72<sup>nd</sup> Bishop of Exeter in an historic service on All Souls Day (2nd November) at Exeter Cathedral.

Bishop Mike began the service by processing from Exeter's Guildhall to Cathedral Green, along with Exeter's Lord Mayor





Before he was permitted to enter the Cathedral, the bishop had to strike the Great West door three times with his staff, in keeping with tradition, before being questioned by pupils from Dartmoor Multi-Academy Trust with the traditional words "We welcome you. Who are you and why are you here?" The bishop replied: "I am Mike, a servant of Jesus Christ."
