Rev Linda Cronin writes:

We have just begun a sermon series at St Greg's based around Nehemiah.

In our first week we looked at Nehemiah's broken heart, as he heard about the broken walls of his beloved city Jerusalem. He was so sad that he mourned and fasted and prayed for 4 months!

Nehemiah eventually does something about the situation. But before he does anything to try to fix the situation, he prays. That's his FIRST response. Prayer isn't something Nehemiah does when he's already tried to fix the situation!

We were particularly challenged by the 'shape' of Nehemiah's prayer, which I suggest could be a pattern for our own prayer life.

So a recap of Nehemiah ch1 v 1-11:

Adoration: Nehemiah begins by praising God as "the great and awesome God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments".

Confession: He acknowledges the sins of the people of Israel, including his own and his father's house, recognizing their unfaithfulness.

Thanksgiving: Nehemiah reminds God of His promise to restore His people if they return to Him and keep His commandments, demonstrating faith in God's covenant.

Supplication: Nehemiah specifically asks for God's ear to be attentive to his prayer and for success in his current endeavour to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

What is demonstrated?

Faith in God's Promises: Nehemiah's prayer showcases trust in God's faithfulness and His willingness to keep His promises to His people.

Humility and Confession: The prayer emphasises the importance of acknowledging personal and collective sinfulness before seeking God's favour.

Intercession for Others: Nehemiah's prayer is for the well-being of his people and the restoration of Jerusalem, demonstrating the power of intercessory prayer.

Guidance and Success: Nehemiah's prayer includes a request for God's guidance and success in his mission to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem, highlighting the importance of seeking God's will in our endeavours.

In essence, Nehemiah's prayer is a model for believers seeking God's guidance, acknowledging their dependence on Him, and trusting in His promises for restoration and renewal.

We raised these questions:

Are you burdened about Dawlish?

Are you heartbroken about our world and its condition?

Are there things as St Greg's we need to confess from the past?

Are there still remnants of past hurts and failures?

We recognised the need to pray!

As a result, we have committed to pray every Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday evening at 6pm at St Greg's for just 30 minutes, every week. About 10-12 folk have joined in doing this and you would be very welcome to join us or maybe you would like to do something similar at St George's, St Mary's or St Paul's. If you do, then please speak to Revd Linda or Revd Patrick about this.

BISHOP MOIRA'S SERVICE OF INSTALLATION

The Rt. Rev'd Moira Astin, the new Bishop of Crediton, was officially welcomed to her new role with a Service of Installation at Exeter Cathedral on Sunday 6th July. She also preached her inaugural sermon based on the story of Moses and the Burning Bush and John 17:20-26, speaking of the importance of names and the importance of the name we call God by. 

A Quiet Day in the Bishop's Garden with St Clare of Assisi 10.30am - 3.30pm on Tuesday 19th August 2025 led by Demelza Henderson



St Clare of Assisi lived a life of poverty, simplicity and prayer in the 13th century, sharing a deep love of God's creation with her contemporary, St Francis. The Bishop of Exeter has kindly offered his garden for this Quiet Day, which will explore aspects of Clare's life through prayer, poetry, music and, of course, her own writings. There will be plenty of silence throughout the day for you to reflect on how Clare's witness might continue to inspire your own Christian life today.

Demelza Henderson leads Quiet Days and longer residential retreats across the UK through her work with the Association for Promoting Retreats. She is also an Oblate of the Society of Our Lady of the Isles, which combines her love of contemplative prayer with her joy in the natural world.

Some practicalities:

- Location: Bishop's Palace Garden, Palace Gate, Exeter, EX1 1HY
- Parking: There is no parking at the Bishop's Palace; please use a public car park.
- Refreshments: The day will start at 10am with tea/coffee. You will be able to use the kitchen to make your own drinks throughout the day, but please bring a packed lunch.
- Seating: There are a few benches scattered around the Bishop's garden, but it would be helpful if you could bring your own fold-up chair or a rug if you are able.
- Toilet facilities will be available inside the Bishop's Palace.
- <u>Disabled Facilites</u> are limited; sadly the gravel paths and lawn are uneven and thus unsuitable for wheelchairs, but there is an accessible toilet inside for those who need it.
- Cost: The day will cost £10 to cover expenses, payable in advance to Demelza.
