

JESUS DIED TO SAVE THE PLANET'

Preb.Chris Curd, Dawlish Mission Community Eco-Champion writes:

As we approach Rogation Sunday on 25th May let's think theologically, in a God/Gospel centred and prayerful way about the environmental and ecological issues and challenges we are faced with both locally and globally.

"Jesus died to save the planet", is a booklet from the London Institute for Contemporary Christianity. It reinforces the truth that the gospel isn't just good news for humanity. It's good news for the whole planet.




The breakdown of the earth's climate and ecology is deeply rooted in human sin. Yet all too often we treat protecting nature as a fringe issue – a specialist topic that some Christians care about, not an essential part of the church's mission. But Jesus died and rose to reconcile and renew all things – people, animals, plants, and the earth itself. That means that helping creation flourish is central to following him. We must live our whole lives in line with God's mission: for his glory and the good of the entire world. Clear-eyed, biblical, and hopeful, this essay will help you rediscover God's good purposes for his world, achieved through Jesus' work on the cross. And in response, it will inspire you to Christlike action.

Chris Wright (Global Ambassador, Langham Partnership) says: 'There is a prophetic, Jeremiah-like urgency to this essay, calling the church to wake up and get serious about this issue. But, also like Jeremiah, Paul Kunert calls for repentance and holds out hope.'

SUPPORT OUR CHRISTIAN SCHOOLS' WORKER HERE IN DAWLISH

Mark Jones, ROC Dawlish Local Coordinator, writes:

ROC Dawlish is incredibly grateful for the support it receives in its vital ministry of resourcing our ecumenical Christian Schools' Worker, Adam Gidney, who helps take the light of Christ into our Dawlish primary and secondary schools.

Through assemblies, lunchtime clubs, RE lessons, and much-needed pastoral support, Adam's presence, along with support from the lead ministers, and that of his growing volunteer team, is **a living witness of God's love** to hundreds of young people each week. It is often the only time children hear about Christianity in this hectic secular world.

This work is practical discipleship in action. As one Year Five child recently said to Adam in an Easter-themed RE class: "What I like about the Easter story is that God came down from heaven and got involved; even though I do naughty things sometimes, he's still bothered about me."

Adam will be sharing more recent stories at **Reaching Dawlish 6** on **Friday 23rd May in The Manor House** (6-8.30pm). Book your free ticket at: <u>reaching dawlish 6.eventbrite.co.uk</u>

However, due to rising employment costs and inflation, we are now facing a **funding shortfall of £5k per year** to sustain this role. Without more support, the future of this Christian outreach in Dawlish is uncertain. In addition to this unforeseen shortfall, Adam's role is continuing to expand, for which we thank God. **An additional £5k per year** would enable us to employ Adam for an extra day each week — creating a much-needed full-time job. This would allow even greater support and consistency in our local schools, helping to meet the growing spiritual and pastoral opportunities the Lord is opening to us. God is at work in our schools and, with the support of churches in Dawlish, **we are asking for your help**. Can you prayerfully consider whether you, as an organisation or an individual could help meet this need, through regular giving or a one-off gift?

To end, some more recent words of encouragement received from Adam himself:

"I did an assembly yesterday on National Walking to School week. I asked the children by putting up their hands to order what they appreciated most when they walked to school. We had topics like 'Nature', 'Friends', 'Quiet Time'. I added 'God Time' and when I asked them to put up their hands around 20 did. But then more and more started to do so until we had around 80-100 children! It was a wave of declaration. It honestly felt like there was some real spiritual prompting going on!"





ST.GREG'S SEEKS VOLUNTEERS FOR 'CHURCHES COUNT ON NATURE'

Caring for God's Acre (CfGA) is a national charity promoting the conservation of burial sites and supporting the people who look after and maintain them. Many burial sites are managed by a few volunteers who are keen to preserve both the monuments

and the wildlife but want guidance on how best to achieve this. CfGA can help them to preserve rare species of plants and wildflowers and advise on management of grassland to encourage wildlife whilst still allowing access to visitors and relatives.

Love Your Burial Ground Week, National Cemeteries Week and Churches Count on Nature all run from 7th to 15th June with all sorts of events and activities from history talks to wildlife surveys being publicised on the CfGA website. St Greg's are to take part in 'Churches Count on Nature' which involves recording all the wildlife and plantlife in the churchyard over that week. There will be an Ascension Day Service on Thursday 29th May at 7:00pm at the Methodist Church and CTDD will be




NEWS OF REV LINDA
