WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM MY FRIEND(S)?

Rev Patrick Parkes writes:

Any fans of The Beatles will immediately recognise the lyrics from their 1967 album 'Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band'. Written jointly by John and Paul and, unusually, sung by Ringo Starr. However, did you know when used in the singular, that same phrase can be used to describe the working of the third person of the Trinity?

The assistance promised by Jesus to his disciples following his death and resurrection came in the person of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost, an event we celebrated this year, on Sunday 8th June.



It is far easier to visualise the image of God as Father in heaven, or Jesus as Son on earth living amongst us as one of us than it is to envisage the Holy Spirit. He is often depicted in art in the form of either a dove or a burning flame, echoing the two visible appearances recorded in scripture at both Christ's baptism and amongst the disciples in the upper room.

Jesus described Him in various ways, as a 'helper', someone just like himself. The term is sometimes translated as 'Comforter' one who offers solace in times of stress, or 'Advocate' one who stands alongside us and acts on our behalf or in our defence.

He brings courage and imbues those who receive Him with: boldness in the face of danger, wisdom in times of confusion, and recollection (especially of Christ's teaching) when our own memory fails us.

His presence in the lives of those early disciples enabled them to face a far from certain future with courage and conviction; to overcome their craven fear of those who had killed their Lord and master and to boldly proclaim a new message of love and reconciliation to a hostile world.

Friendship is a wonderful gift and I trust that you are surrounded by people who love you and look out for you. There will, no doubt, be times in our lives when we will rely on the depth and quality of those friendships, times when they evidence their true worth.

For Christians there is also the consolation of knowing that when we come to an end of ourselves and our strength fails, and even when others cannot provide the support we need, there is always another comforter, just like Jesus, who is there for us, sustaining us and supporting us in our time of need.

My prayer is that you too may know the joy of true friendship and the presence of God the Holy Spirit who fortifies us through life's trials and brings us into 'times of refreshing' from the Lord. (*Acts 3:21*)

SAMARA'S AID Preb. Chris Curd writes:

Many will know of Samara's Aid, originally working in Iraq at the time of ISIS and now working in Syria, where much of the work is overseen by the Syrian Director Dr A. On 24th June Samara sent out an email and this is part of it. It is shared for information and for prayer.



"These are very dark days in Syria and we ask for your urgent prayers for protection for our team and projects please. In the early hours of this morning our rural outreach centre and farm project in Syria were attacked. Armed men arrived at the projects, shooting. They forced their way into our shepherd's home at gunpoint, destroyed the contents of the home we built for him including the furniture, doors and everything they could. They beat him viciously in front of his wife and young children then took him outside, forcing him and our guard to kneel in front of their guns in the manner that armed groups like this do when they execute people.

Our shepherd pleaded in front of the barrels of their guns for them not to kill them, explaining that these projects are run by Christians and that this charity is serving the poor and everyone in need, regardless of their faith or any other characteristics. The shepherd himself is a Sunni Muslim who has a beautiful, gentle personality and who has been so faithful over the years. He hoped his words might deter them, but they replied that they were doing this because it is run by Christians, and said they knew everything about it. They spelt out very clearly that it is their intention to kill Dr A, that they plan to hunt him down, that they want his head, and that they will show him no mercy when they find him.

When the shepherd tried to reason with them, trying to stop them from killing our Alawite guard, they beat him more. They damaged our storage spaces searching for something they didn't find, making false accusations. They stole all our sheep and horses.

We don't know why they didn't kill our shepherd and guard because all their behaviour and actions indicated that this was exactly what they were in the process of doing. We thank God for all the prayers you have prayed for our team for protection over the years, recent months and weeks. God has answered by sparing their lives and also in locating and returning some of our sheep and horses. 46 sheep and one horse remain unaccounted for. These armed men threatened our shepherd that if he said anything to the police, they would return and kill his children. Please pray that this family will all be protected, along with the guard, as they are terrified now."

A Quiet Day in the Bishop's Garden with St Clare of Assisi 10.30am - 3.30pm on Tuesday 19th August 2025 led by Demelza Henderson



St Clare of Assisi lived a life of poverty, simplicity and prayer in the 13th century, sharing a deep love of God's creation with her contemporary, St Francis. The Bishop of Exeter has kindly offered his garden for this Quiet Day, which will explore aspects of Clare's life through prayer, poetry, music and, of course, her own writings. There will be plenty of silence throughout the day for you to reflect on how Clare's witness might continue to inspire your own Christian life today.

Demelza Henderson leads Quiet Days and longer residential retreats across the UK through her work with the Association for Promoting Retreats. She is also an Oblate of the Society of Our Lady of the Isles, which combines her love of contemplative prayer with her joy in the natural world.

Some practicalities:

- Location: Bishop's Palace Garden, Palace Gate, Exeter, EX1 1HY
- <u>Parking:</u> There is no parking at the Bishop's Palace; please use a public car park.
- <u>Refreshments:</u> The day will start at 10am with tea/coffee. You will be able to use the kitchen to make your own drinks throughout the day, but please bring a packed lunch.
- <u>Seating:</u> There are a few benches scattered around the Bishop's garden, but it would be helpful if you could bring your own fold-up chair or a rug if you are able.
- <u>Toilet facilities</u> will be available inside the Bishop's Palace.
- <u>Disabled Facilites</u> are limited; sadly the gravel paths and lawn are uneven and thus
 unsuitable for wheelchairs, but there is an accessible toilet inside for those who need it.
- <u>Cost:</u> The day will cost £10 to cover expenses, payable in advance to Demelza.
