Dawlish with Holcombe and Cofton
5th November 2023



You are all aware, we hope, of St Mary's Church Hall at Dawlish Warren. It was built on land given by the Earl of Devon completed in 1951, in memory of Reverend Charles Francis Benthall Vicar of Cofton Parish from 1891 to 1918 who inaugurated open air services in Dawlish Warren in 1911, with funds raised in the Parish and from other donations to commemorate his ministry. It was to have a Christian witness in Dawlish Warren and

provide a facility for the community. By 1962 three services were held in the Hall on a Sunday! It was used by youth groups for residential holidays. By the 1990s the hall was being used a lot less; the building was deteriorating and a massive financial drain on St Mary's Church. Something had to be done. If kept it had to prove its worth and be self-funding.

So ...Dorothea Hall with other members of the then St Mary's Parochial Church Council took on the mammoth job of raising funds to improve facilities re-establishing Sunday services and promoting community use of the Hall. A great amount of organising, paperwork and elbow grease brought the Hall to what it is today. We should be forever grateful to Dorothea and friends for the Hall we have. From 2003 the use of the Hall grew and after Covid-19 usage really took off.

The Hall is now used by many groups in the community, Busy Bees Babes and Tots, Exemplar dogs, Yoga, Ballroom Dancing, Pilates, the Dogs Nose, Dawlish Art Group, High C's, The Art School, Band Practice during the week and at weekends there are children's parties, wedding receptions, Christian Groups, Brownie/cubs/guides residentials, Life Saving Classes etc, etc. and occasional services.





Apart from a weekly cleaner and caretaker the running of the Hall is all undertaken by volunteers. They form a working committee which sadly due to illness and various other commitments has decreased over the last few years, the Hall committee as it is at present is, apart from a couple of younger people made up of elderly folk. It is a big

commitment but a very worthwhile one to see what can be achieved with the help of the Lord. We are continually upgrading and improving facilities, over the last couple of years we have installed a new large electric cooker (the gas one was condemned), a large new shed for storage, surrounded the grassed area with a picket fence, had a new picnic bench made and over this summer we had a gazebo for use by anyone using the Hall when the sun got too hot. We have just had ceilings in the toilets and hall repaired and re-painted after three leaks at the beginning of the year and the rear kitchen wall repaired and re-decorated. All this through the lettings of the hall and fund raising by the committee.



It is a big project to keep going and we are always on the look-out for new committee members so if you would fancy coming along to work on the committee take on various necessary roles and commit to what is needed not just for a short time but for the long haul then please contact Ruth Cann on 01626 864537 email ruthcann737@btinternet.com

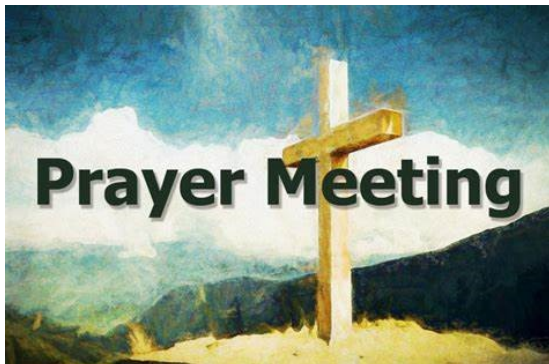

Service of Remembering and Hope - Sunday 5th November



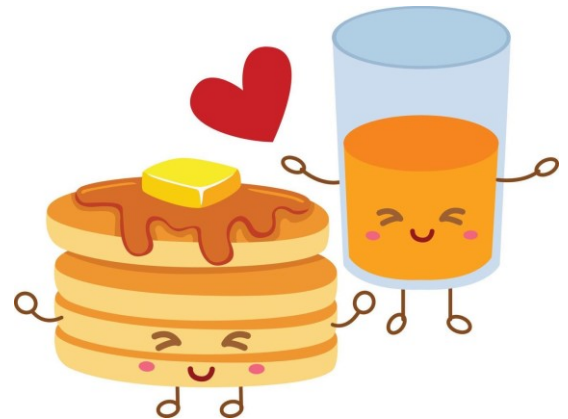

Update from Chris Curd

Profuse apologies from Chris Curd for 2 major omissions from the November Coastline:

1) thank you to Liz Hawarth for so ably producing the October edition and enabling me to have a break.

2) The Apple Cake recipe:

The Apple cake made by Cliff was much appreciated at the St Greg's Harvest Bring and Share, and I said I would put the recipe in Coastline. (Oops!) But here it is:

8oz SR flour
4 oz butter or substitute
4 oz granulated sugar
1 egg
pinch salt
sultanas
apples



- Grease an 8" or 9" shallow cake tin - it is easier to turn out if you have one with a loose base
- melt the butter and sugar together, and when sufficiently cool (so the egg does not scramble!) beat in the egg.
- Then fold in the flour and salt.
- Press two thirds of the mixture into the tin, making sure it reaches right up to the edges.
- Then arrange sliced apples on the top and if desired sprinkle with sultanas and a coarse brown sugar.
- Then "dollop" the rest of the mixture in small balls over the top.
- Bake in your oven's equivalent of gas mark 4 for about 40 minutes and then enjoy.

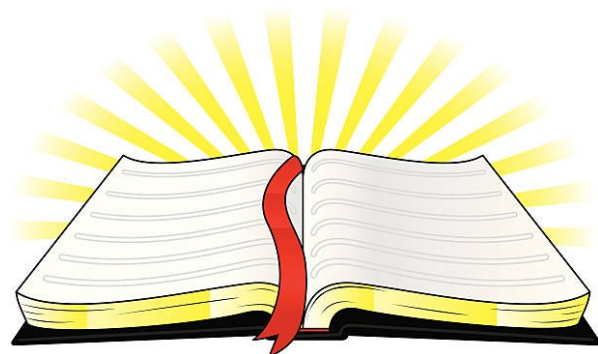
Delicious hot or cold, with custard, cream, natural yoghurt, creme fraiche etc. Freezes well.

Cliff's tip: Leave the base of the tin in the cake when freezing and prise it off when frozen. (Or leave it on if you don't need it again soon!).

Bellringing at St Greg's in November

You may have noticed that during 2023 the St Greg's church bells have been rung more frequently than just Wednesday evening practice night and Sunday mornings.

We are very fortunate that our bells are recognised as a lovely ring and that makes us popular with other bellringing bands who very much enjoy coming to ring them too.

On 18th November the Topsham bellringers will be coming to St Greg's to ring our bells from 2 to 3:30 pm and on the afternoon of 23rd of November the U3A group have a visit to our church and tower booked and it's likely some of them may have a try at Ringing, closely supervised by Mick Wallis our Ringing master. So if you do hear the bells ringing on the 18th and or 23rd November- it isn't your ears ringing it will be real people.

Of course 12th November is also Remembrance Sunday and the bells will be rung for this special occasion. Traditionally on this Sunday, the bells are half-muffled meaning they sound a little different and create a moving echo sound which does in many people's opinion sound quite beautiful. So listen out for this on Sunday 12.11.23 when as your St Greg's ringers, we'll try to do this extra well.

We very much hope that for those of you who enjoy hearing the bells this news comes as a pleasant surprise, and for those of you less keen on the sound the bells make, you won't be too disturbed by this additional ringing. Please do share this information with your neighbours in Dawlish who might not otherwise get to hear about this extra ringing.
