CHRISTMAS RULES! Our Rector, Rev Linda Cronin, writes:

Dear friends

Just for fun - some Christmas laws!

- ❖ A law passed by Charles II in 1677 makes it illegal on Christmas Day for any "person whatsoever to do or exercise any worldly labour, business or work of their ordinary callings."
- ❖ It is illegal to handle fish in suspicious circumstances. Section 32 of the Salmon Act 1986 makes it an offence to handle fish in suspicious circumstances. The Act used to just apply only to salmon, but it was amended to include other fish by the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009.
- ❖ It is illegal to ride or drive to church on Christmas Day. Edward VI's law of 1551 set this out, and it was modified by George III in 1780 allowing police to confiscate and sell any vehicle parked close to a church, the money being distributed to the poor and needy.
- ❖ It is illegal to eat more than three courses of Christmas dinner at a restaurant or hotel, according to a William IV law which was part of the People's Charter of 1836.
- ❖ It is illegal to eat mince pies on Christmas Day! (Well, it was in 1644, as 25 December that year fell on a legally-mandated day of fasting).

There's more - just take a google on the internet!

So, I'm not supposed to drive to Church on Christmas Day, eat more than three courses of Christmas dinner and definitely no mince pies! Well, I firmly believe we need to keep 'the main thing, the main thing!' Without Christ there is no *Christ*mas is there? Christmas celebrates the birth of Jesus Christ, with the name meaning "*Christ's Mass*". We will celebrate Christ's mass across our Church's next week at various times and places.

I'd like to leave you with a question to ponder – in all the festivities, food, family, friends etc how will you keep 'the main thing, the main thing'?

"Dear Lord, don't let us miss You this Christmas season. Help us to simplify our activities and traditions so we can focus our celebration on Your birth. Thank You for being the Prince of Peace, and I ask You for that supernatural peace to reign in our hearts. Thank You for the simple but I life-changing message of Your love for us. And I wished it was Christmas each night of the year


Yes I wished it was Christmas each night of the year.
